Letter from the Director

2021 was a year of many challenges and accomplishments for the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles. Our DMV team remained as dedicated as ever to providing excellent services to the people of Nebraska as the world continued to adapt and move on from the COVID-19 pandemic.

For the first time in more than a decade, there is a new design of the Nebraska driver's license and state ID. This design, revealed and implemented in June, is not only an aesthetic change, but also provides a significant security upgrade for customers. Each document with the new design has layers of security features that make it among the most secure government-issued documents on the market. Unfortunately, in today's world, criminals can make sophisticated counterfeits, but these new documents will protect the identities of Nebraskans. The new documents are issued at no additional cost to the customer. Additionally, like all licenses and IDs issued in Nebraska since 2013, the new design is REAL ID compliant.

The Nebraska DMV was hard at work overseeing several projects to modernize our services. The new driver's license and ID card design was one facet of the large Credential and Testing System (CATS) project, which is an extensive upgrade of the Driver Licensing Services division. This project took many big steps forward in addition to the new design. The Motor Carrier Services division launched its modernization project in late 2021, titled "McOne," a project that will improve services we provide to trucking businesses large and small. The project will be completed in 2024.

The Driver and Vehicle Records division oversaw the launch of a record 16 new specialty license plates, and continues to utilize and refine the innovative VicToRy system. The Financial Responsibility division continues to provide excellent service by reducing phone wait times and assisting customers online through live chats. The Legal, Information Services, and Administrative divisions all took on and assisted in projects around the agency to aid in the agency's goal of improving services for Nebraskans.

Improving our services is not possible through technological innovation alone. Our team must also be invested and have the right tools and environment to make change. To aid in that, we launched a teammate engagement committee to cultivate ideas on how to improve the agency for both customers and our own team.

Our continuous effort to bring new and modernized services received international recognition in 2021. For the third time in as many years, one of our new services received an International Award from the Association of American Motor Vehicle Administrators, as well as two regional awards.

We would not be able to meet our goals as an agency without our partnerships with state legislators, fellow state agencies, customers, county officials, and private industry.

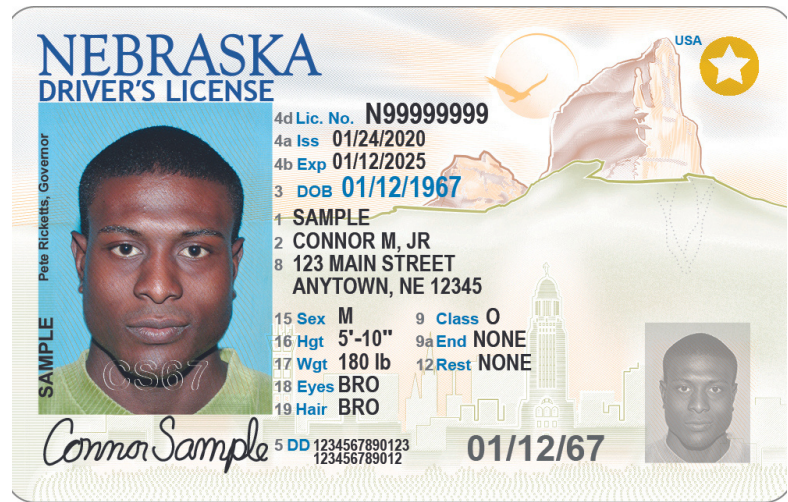
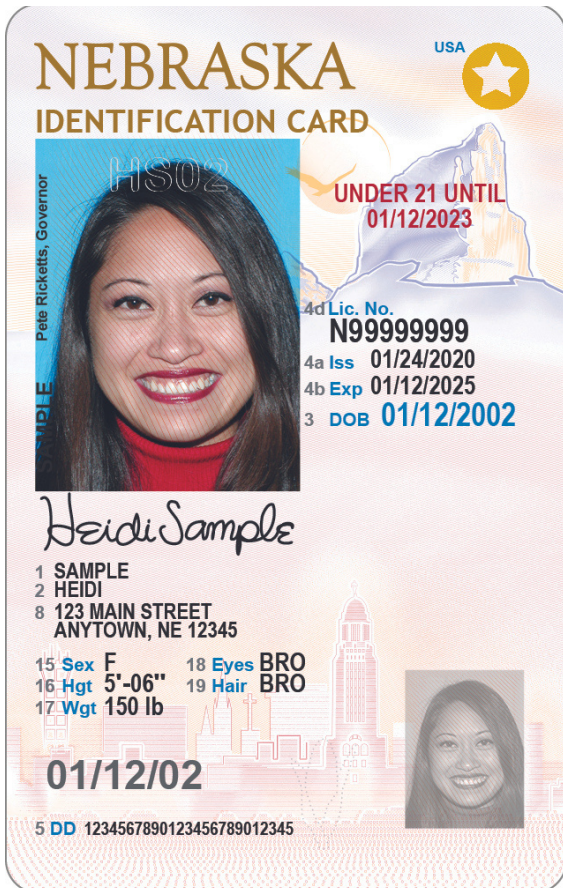

New Nebraska Drivers License



The Nebraska DMV unveiled and implemented a new design of the Nebraska driver's license and state ID card. In addition to the aesthetic changes, the new documents also feature bolstered security, protecting identities and reducing counterfeits. The new design was unveiled at a press conference at the Metro West Driver Licensing Office in Omaha in June.



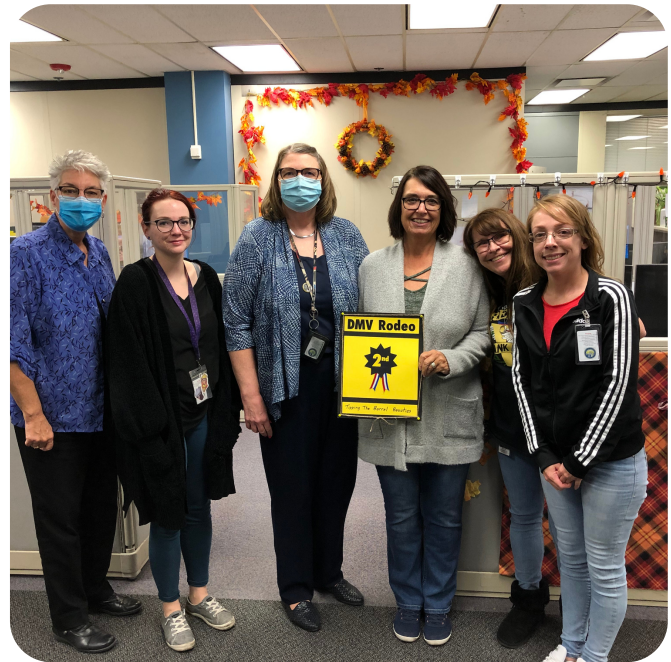

Charitable Giving Campaign

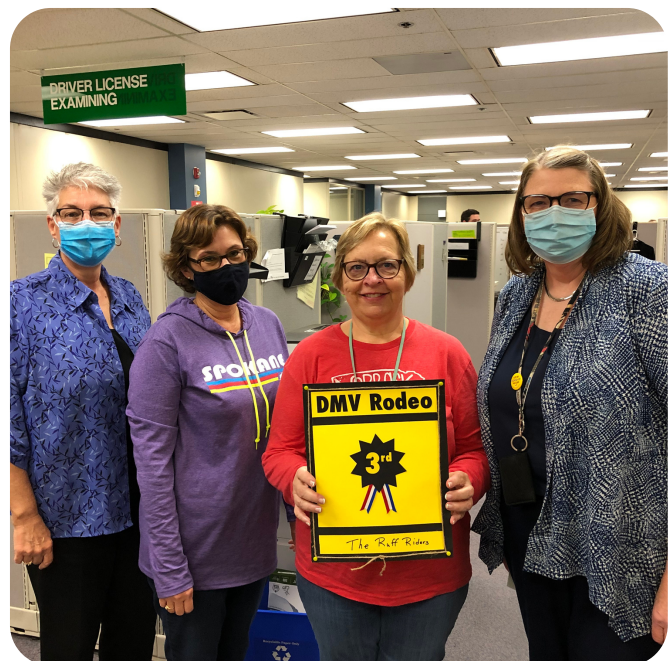

AAMVA Awards



The Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles received an International Award from the Association of American Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA). The award was in the "Improvement Through Efficiencies" category and recognized the department's launch of the Fleet eServices program. The program is an online portal for businesses to manage their fleet of vehicles and submit required paperwork for their fleets online. The department also received the regional level award in the same category.

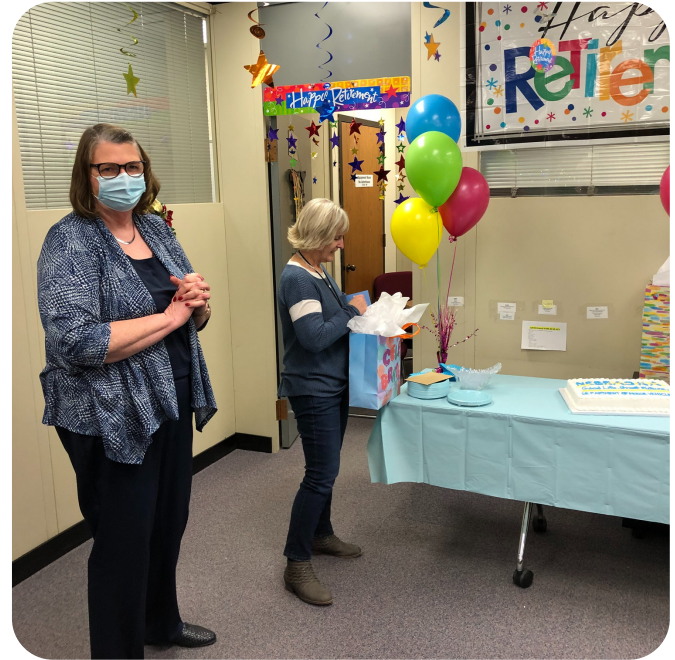
Additionally, the Nebraska DMV received a Regional Award in the "Excellence in Government Partnership" category. The award was given jointly to the Nebraska DMV and Nebraska State Patrol for their collaborative Intelligent Roadside Operations Computer (iROC) system. The system is capable of logging important information about passing trucks at several key points on the Interstate in Nebraska, and can alert NSP officers to vehicles in need of addition screening while allowing vehicles in compliance to pass without stopping at a weigh station.

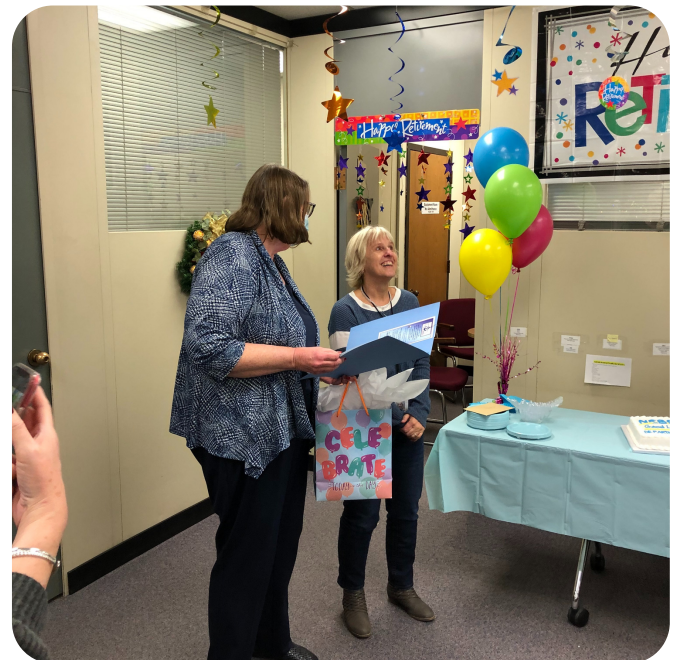

Administration

The Administration Division provide overall assistance to the operations of all divisions within the Department of Motor Vehicles. The Nebraska DMV is charged with the administration and enforcement of motor vehicle regulations and education of vehicle operators. The DMV ensures licensed drivers meet the eligibility requirements for operating a motor vehicle and those vehicles are properly titled and registered. An additional purpose is to generate and collect revenues that support not only the services offered by DMV but also other state and local government entities. The director also serves as the chairperson of the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board.

Accomplishments

Implemented a new design of Nebraska driver's licenses and state ID cards.

Hired a new project manager.

Received more than 300,000 views and interactions on the agency's social media pages.

Launched a teammate engagement committee.

Goals

Continue to modernize agency technology systems.

Increase public awareness and outreach.

Training

The Training Division is responsible for the coordination of training and the presentation of various classes in support of the organization's commitment to employee development. They assess and evaluate training programs for effectiveness and develop adult learning opportunities for professional growth. Major focus includes creating employee learning to ensure compliance with standards and regulations.

Accomplishments

Created and implemented an online tutorial on GLA training for a smooth transition to online leave time planning.

Conducted four supervisor seminars on the following subjects: performance reviews, de-escalation, work-life balance, and First Amendment Auditors.

Assigned 39 modules to new DMV teammates.

Conducted 14 two-week training sessions to new driver licensing examiners.

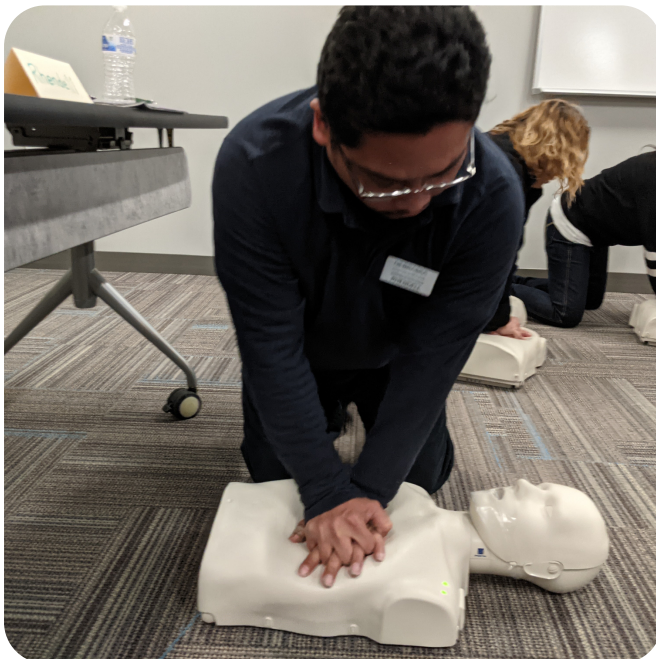
Facilitated CPR and AED training to 25 examiners.

Training

The Training Division facilitated CPR and AED training to driver licensing examiners in the field. In 2021, there were several medical emergencies at driver licensing offices. Thanks to a combination of quick action and knowledge of CPR, several lives were ultimately saved. These CPR classes helped prepare DMV teammates for future emergencies.

Information Systems

The Information Systems Division is responsible for the development, maintenance and support of service applications and data hosted by the DMV. With the support of the Office of the CIO and NIC Nebraska, the DMV services are easily available online, at County Treasurer offices and at DMV locations throughout the state.

Accomplishments

Deployed a driver's license credentialing system.

Updated TLS to 1.2 on all systems.

Refreshed desktop hardware at the State Office Building.

Moved the old DMV domain from Old World to New World.

Migrated existing systems on the DMV domain to the STN domain.

Goals

Modernize road and skill test.

Upgrade FileBound to version 7.5.

Implement QFlow online appointment system.

Assess security and mitigate risks on all systems.

Legal

The Legal Division performs and manages legal work for the Department to support the work of the agency's other divisions. Major focuses include preparation and support of agency legislation; preparation, review, and renewal of contracts; preparation and review of various legal documents; review of federal laws and regulations to comply with federal mandates; and conducting administrative appeals for the agency. The Legal Division handles applications for persons applying to the Board of Pardons for reprieve of fifteen year license revocations, manages certification of Safety Training Option Programs (STOP), certifies ignition interlock providers, and provides manufacturers' warranty information to the public.

Drafted and finished several guidance documents for dealer automated services, commercial driver's license issuance requirements, electronic signatures for titles, and medical and vision requirements for drivers.

Managed all other administrative hearings and appeals.

Administered and certified the ignition interlock providers in conjunction with the issuance of the ignition interlock permit (IIP).

Provided legal guidance on issues including the ADA, FMLA, EEOC filings, grievances, appeals, and COVID-19 related guidelines.

Financial Responsibility

The Financial Responsibility Division (FR) identifies individuals from driving, court, and crash records who have unsafe driving histories. Driving privileges are denied via disqualification (in the case of CDLs), suspension, or revocation and subsequently reinstated when qualified. The division facilitates the issuance of employment, medical hardship and ignition interlock permits. It also aids in the collection of traffic fines and child support payment.

Accomplishments

Completed a project to improve the process of merging driving records.

Added two new insurance companies to the Electronic SR22 Single Submit program.

Responded to 75,780 phone inquiries and assisted 4,548 walk-in customers.

Motor Carrier Services

The Motor Carrier Services Division assists the trucking industry by administering a variety of programs related to the industry which include regulating compliance with the International Registration Plan (IRP), the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) and the Unified Carrier Registration System (UCR). These programs collect and distribute fees and taxes between member states and provinces.

Accomplishments

Underwent a FMCSA ITD Core Compliance Review. The final report was issued June 2, 2021, with no deficiencies or recommendations identified.

Modified IRP registration fees from \$32 to \$35 per ton which will aid in funding a modernization project.

Handled a significant increase in IRP and IFTA accounts (20% increase from 2020).

Met and exceeded the number of audits required by IRP, IFTA, and UCR agreements.

Goals

Continue work on the MCS modernization project.

Meet and exceed the number of audits required by IRP, IFTA, and UCR agreements.

Monitor the continuing decrease in IFTA dollars collected.

It is our mission to have exceptional employees deliver accurate, secure, and innovative services.

Continued to process applicants statewide offering all services including the administration of all skills testing for cars, motorcycles and commercial motor vehicles during the pandemic.

Continued work on a new Driver Licensing System containing photo capture, electronic knowledge and skills testing and document issuance.

Prepared for the implementation of Entry Level Driver Training, scheduled for February 2022.

Driver and Vehicle Records

Driver and Vehicle Records (DVR) oversees multiple programs including the statewide Vehicle Title and Registration System (VicToRy), the associated online services, and the motor vehicle functions performed by the county treasurers. VicToRy is used by all 93 counties for issuance of titles and registrations and collection of the fees and taxes due for over 2.4 million motor vehicles and boats. Over \$855 million was collected through VicToRy in 2021 which was distributed to over 1,200 local and state agencies. DVR is responsible for oversight and access to the driver record database which maintains the records of 1.5 million licensed drivers and state ID card holders. The DVR Fraud Unit performs investigative work relating to vehicle title and registration fraud, driver license fraud, and odometer fraud. Motor Vehicle Fraud Investigators are certified Nebraska Law Enforcement Officers commissioned as Deputy State Sheriffs.

Accomplishments

Approved approximately 22,000 new specialty license plate applications.

Arrested 72 individuals for motor vehicle related fraud.

Provided application and business support to county officials and the general public.

Completed work for deployment of one new specialty plate.

Implemented driver record fee increase.

Implemented changes to allow TOD (Transfer on Death) notation on all title types (boats, ATVs, UTVs, and trailers) along with no longer requiring a paper title when adding, changing, or removing a TOD beneficiary for all title types.

Completed work for deployment of new application requirements for Gold Star Family, ex-POW, DAV, and Purple Heart license plates.

Implemented 16 new specialty plates and multiple other specialty plate fee distribution changes.

Deployed a VicToRy system upgrade in December 2021.

Provided fraudulent document recognition training for 93 law enforcement agency representatives.

Goals

Maintain the Nebraska Motor Vehicle Insurance Database.

Manage the Electronic Lien and Title Program (ELT).

Administer the state's license plate program including inventory control of 91 types of license plates; design, approve, and issue specialty license plates.

Print and mail over 2.2 million registration renewal notices annually.

Administer 162,000 handicap parking permits.

Utilize the facial recognition process to identify and review potential matches to determine if additional investigation is required prior to driver license or state identification document issuance.
