NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES Executive Summary

The Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles is composed of seven divisions.

Administration: (Rhonda Lahm, Director)

Administration oversees the operations of six divisions, which includes 190 employees and an annual budget of \$22.4 million for FY13-14. Administration includes the deputy director, budget and human resources officers and support staff. The director serves as the chairperson of the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board.

Driver and Vehicle Records (DVR): (Betty Johnson, Administrator)

DVR is responsible for the administration of the statewide Vehicle Titling and Registration System (VTR) and the associated online services. VTR is used by all 93 counties for the titling and registration of Nebraska's over 2.3 million motor vehicles. VTR is the system through which all motor vehicle taxes, motor vehicle fees, motor vehicle registration fees, sales tax, wheel tax, and other assorted fees are collected and distributed to over 1,200 local and state authorities as directed by state statues. Approximately \$600 million was collected through VTR during 2013.

Other responsibilities include the state's license plate program, including the budget, inventory control of the 64 types of license plates throughout all 93 counties, and message and specialty plate programs. The division administers over 120,000 handicapped parking permits and maintains the Insurance Database.

DVR is responsible for the database that maintains the records of 1.4 million licensed drivers and state ID card holders and the Digital Driver License System used by the counties to issue documents. The DVR Help Desk provides technology and business support for county officials and the general public. The DVR Help Desk staff responded to 96,953 calls during 2013

In addition, DVR houses a Fraud Unit that investigates identity theft, driver license fraud, title and odometer fraud, and manages the facial recognition process that has been incorporated into the driver license issuance workflow as a security feature.

Driver Licensing Services (DLS): (Sara O'Rourke, Administrator)

Driver Licensing Services is responsible for ensuring that individuals meet Nebraska's licensing standards and requirements for issuance of driver permits, licenses and State ID Cards. There are 97 exam offices and 114 employees located throughout the State who assist individuals obtain nine different types of permits and six types of licenses and State ID cards. Thirteen of the 97 offices are open five days a week. Approximately 633,903 applicants for driver licenses and identification cards were processed in 2013 in the driver licensing offices. An additional 100,002 applicants were processed via our online driver licensing system. The division utilizes several systems to effectively administer its programs: the Interactive Driver License System, the Digital Driver License System, Automated Testing System and the CDL 3rd Party Tester Database.

The division certified Driver Training Schools, Driver Safety Schools and Commercial Driver License (CDL) Third Party Testers and Examiners and Motorcycle Providers. Driver Training Schools and CDL Third Party Testers are audited annually.

Motor Carrier Services (MCS): (Cathy Beedle, Administrator)

MCS administers a variety of programs relating to the trucking industry, including the International Registration Plan (IRP) that collects and distributes registration fees between member states (48 States, the District of Columbia and 10 Canadian Provinces). In 2013, the division collected nearly \$83 million IRP fees, (retaining \$33 million in Nebraska) and distributing the balance of \$49 million to other IRP jurisdictions.

MCS administers the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) that requires the equitable distribution of fuel tax between member states (48 States, District of Columbia and 10 Provinces). In 2013, the division collected over \$7 million in fuel tax revenues, (retaining \$5.7 million in Nebraska) and distributing \$1.9 million to other IFTA jurisdictions.

The MCS division continues to be a participant in the Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Program which registers commercial motor vehicles engaged in interstate travel and goods. For 2013, MCS satisfied their UCR entitlement and collected \$742,000 for the State, while providing \$1 million to the UCR depository for distribution to other states.

MCS issues certificates of titles for apportioned vehicles and audits UCR, IRP and IFTA returns.

Legal Division: (Noelie Sherdon, Administrator)

Primary duties of the Legal Division involve administrative hearings, management of the Administrative License Revocation (ALR) program, legislation, rules and regulations, legal documents, manufacturer's warranty duties, fifteen-year license revocation reprieves, claims board, and the health advisory board. In 2013, the ALR program helped to reduce Nebraska's human and economic consequences of motor vehicle crashes by affirming the administrative revocation of 8,104 drunk drivers.

Financial Responsibility (FR): (Kathy Van Brocklin, Manager)

The Financial Responsibility Division identifies individuals, from driving, court, and accident records who do not drive safely. FR denies driving privileges via disqualification (CDL licenses), suspension or revocation of driver licenses to those who cannot or will not drive safely, and subsequently the reinstatement of the driver licenses. In 2013, the division revoked/suspended the driver licenses of 60,064 individuals, reinstated 57,884 driver licenses, and recorded 164,978 traffic violation convictions to driving records. FR staff responded to 92,941 phone inquiries. The division had 25,535 reinstatements online versus 7,155 over-the-counter reinstatements. FR is the point of contact for issuance of employment drive and medical hardship permits, as well as ignition interlock restricted licenses. The division aids in the collection of traffic fines and child support order payments.

Information Systems Division (IS): (Keith Dey, Manager)

The Information Systems Division is responsible for the development, installation, maintenance and support of all DMV related business applications.

The IS Division created applications or made enhancements to various programs including the CDL Medical Certification, verification of driver license eligibility, and the creation of a veteran's certification database. Modifications and fee distribution changes were made to the VTR application to centralize the production and distribution of the vehicle renewal process.

Administration Division

The Administration Division is the support services office for the Department of Motor

Vehicles. The division includes the director, deputy director, accounting and finance manager, human resources manager and support staff. Functions in the Administration Division provide overall assistance to the operations of all sections within the Department of Motor Vehicles. The director also serves as the chairperson of the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing board.

Legal Division

The Legal Division performs a variety of tasks within the Department of Motor Vehicles. Primary duties involve administrative hearings, legal advice, legislation, rules and

regulations, preparation and review of legal documents, STOP program certification, Ignition Interlock provider certification, defensive driving class certification, administrative license revocation program, manufacturer's warranty duties, fifteen-year license revocation reprieves, claims board and the health advisory board.


Administrative Hearings

All administrative hearings for the Department are conducted by the Legal Division. Hearings are held for commercial driver license issues such as disqualifications, third party testers, and commercial driver instructors; financial issues involving self-insured vehicle owners; motor carrier services issues, such as: protests under the International Registration Plan (IRP) and the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA); and motor vehicle tax objections. The Legal Division provides regular ALR training presentations at the Grand Island Law Enforcement Training Center.

A staff attorney handles protests under the International Registration Plan (IRP) and the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA). A member of the Legal Division is designated to attend Federal Bankruptcy Court whenever hearings are necessary to protest taxes or fees

owed to the Department.

The majority of hearings are for Administrative License Revocations. Law enforcement officers have the authority to confiscate the license of a driver who refuses to take, or fails a chemical The motorist may contest the automatic revocation by petitioning for a hearing. Department holds a hearing to decide the merit of the driver's claim. On January 1, 2012, LB 667 went into effect which allowed drivers subject to an Administrative License Revocation to obtain an ignition interlock permit and use an interlock device to drive during revocation. In 2013, there were 8,596 sworn reports received documenting automatic revocations, 101 hearings scheduled and 8.104 licenses revoked. Motorists may appeal the DMV decision to the District Court. The Legal Division processed 21 District Court appeals during 2013.



Rules and Regulations, Contracts, Legal Documents

Rules and Regulations are developed through the Legal Division. New and revised rules and regulations are initiated by changes in statutes, require a public hearing and are reviewed and approved by the Attorney General and the Governor. The Legal Division works with other DMV divisions, the public and other agencies to develop these rules and regulations. In 2013, the division promulgated two sets of rules and regulations, one governing Parking Permits for Handicapped and Disabled Persons, and another governing Driver Training Schools and Instructors. A public hearing was held on rules and regulations governing the Motorcycle Safety Education Program.

The Legal Division reviews and drafts contracts and other legal documents involving other agencies, outside companies, and the public.

Fifteen-Year License Revocation Reprieves

A person whose license has been revoked for 15 years may file an application for reinstatement after seven years of the revocation have passed. The Legal Division reviews each application and prepares a written recommendation for the Director to provide to the Board of Pardons. In 2013, 60 applications were processed; 26 were granted reprieves.

Manufacturer's Warranty Duties (Lemon Law)

The Legal Division provides lemon law information to interested consumers. Staff answers telephone inquiries and provides information on the Internet and through brochures. Nebraska is a founding member of the International Association of Lemon Law Administrators, which was organized to facilitate the flow of lemon law information across all jurisdictions on behalf of consumers. Nebraska's lemon law requires manufacturers to make a new vehicle conform to the vehicle's written warranty through either an informal settlement with a consumer or in response to a lawsuit in state court by a consumer.

Claims Board


All claims filed against the Department of Motor Vehicles are handled by a staff attorney representing the DMV before the Claims Board. The staff attorney coordinates the agency's response to the claim and any arguments made to the Claims Board.

Public Records/Public Meetings

The Legal Division coordinates responses to public records requests received by the DMV to

comply with all applicable statutory requirements.

Legal coordinates compliance with the law if the Department holds meetings subject to the Public Meetings Law.

Information Systems Division

The Information Systems Division of the Department of Motor Vehicles provides the technological tools, expertise and support needed to develop more efficient methods to serve our external customers, employees, and the citizens of Nebraska.

To meet this goal the division has personnel who specialize in:

- The management of computer systems on the IBM AS/400, IBM Mainframe and Intel platforms.
- The development, installation training and support of technical solutions and business applications.
- Wired and wireless networks.
- Server installation and support.
- PC support, software installation and troubleshooting.
- Project management.

The focus of the DMV has been to provide customers with easy access to both services and data hosted by the DMV. DMV online services are provided through Nebraska.Gov (www.nebraska.gov), NCJIS (Nebraska Criminal Justice Information System) and to the customers of the Department of Motor Vehicles at www.clickdmv.ne.gov. Direct system to system interfaces are supported by DMV and Office of the Chief Information Officer staff.

As the DMV moves towards more accessible services, coordination and cooperation with other state agencies and third-party vendors is critical. Digital technologies are being developed and implemented to maintain and improve the security of our personal identities while making our services and information easily accessible.

Major activities in 2013:

In addition to the regular hardware updates, application enhancements, legislated modifications and maintenance of systems; the following occurred:

Driver Licensing Services application additions and enhancements include: changes to CDL (Commercial Driver License) medical certification; enhancements to verification of lawful status (VLS 2.0); changes to Driver Safety and Motorcycle Instructor waivers; implementation of QAS address verification software; provisions for military personnel waiver; and creation of a veterans certification database.

Modifications and fee distribution changes were made to the VTR (Vehicle Title and Registration) application to centralize the production and distribution of the vehicle renewal process.

The Motor Carrier Division developed and implemented an online 'Trip and Fuel Permit' service to enable commercial carriers to purchase permits online prior to entering Nebraska.

Motor Carrier Services Division

The Division of Motor Carriers "One-Stop Shop" administers a variety of programs relating to the trucking industry:

- The International Registration Plan (IRP), a vehicle registration program whose purpose is to collect and distribute registration fees between member states.
- The International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA), an agreement between member states for the purpose of equitable distribution of fuel tax.
- The Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) program. All motor carriers, motor private carriers, brokers and freight forwarders are required to pay UCR fees annually.
- The issuance of certificates of title, noting of liens and collection of sales tax and tire fee for apportioned vehicles.
- The auditing of motor carrier fuel and mileage records, in accordance with the IRP, IFTA and UCR agreements.
- The MCS Division has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that allows the division to act as an agent in the collection of the Federal Heavy Use Tax (Form 2290) and remit the form and payment to the IRS on behalf of the taxpayer.


Major activities in 2013:


IRP, Inc. completed a five year compliance review of the division and its IRP operations. The peer review team published their final report and found Nebraska Motor Carrier Services in complete compliance on both the administrative and audit side. There were no findings of non-compliance contained in the report.

With the passage of LB250, DMV was charged with implementing an online trip and fuel permit system. The new system was placed into production on the DMV web site December 16, 2013, one full year ahead of the legislative mandate.

The Division purchased and began using a new product, DB Software, for the administration of IRP and IFTA audits.

The Division continues to maintain and enhance support for federal programs they are aligned with which include: Performance Registration Information System Management (PRISM), and Commercial Vehicles Information Systems and Networks (CVISN).

Major activities in 2013:

Legislative Changes

Legislative changes required updates to the interlock and other general computer applications.

LB 751 – passed in 2012

• Effective October 27, 2013 the bill provided a serious violation for commercial drivers for texting while operating a commercial motor vehicle.

LB 158 -

Removed the restricted driving limits for ignition interlock permit holders.
 Permit holders are only restricted to operation of a vehicle equipped with an ignition interlock system and have no other driving restrictions.

This past year the Financial Responsibility Division worked with Nebraska.gov to modernize the appearance of our web based reinstatement application. Enhancements were made to allow individuals to check their eligibility for the ignition interlock permit and to apply for the permit online. We continue to work with Nebraska.gov to allow interlock providers the opportunity to electronically transmit the interlock install information. Currently the interlock install information is mailed or faxed.

Customer Service

Financial Responsibility Staff responded to 92,941 phone inquiries.

Other activities involved in the achievement of goals include:


- processing driver license suspensions, revocations, and reinstatements which includes data entry on computer work files;

- responding to phone inquiries and walk-in customers.







Driver Licensing Services

The goal of Driver Licensing Services is to ensure that persons who meet Nebraska's identification and licensing requirements are issued a permit, operator license or commercial driver license and that individuals who meet the identification requirements set forth in state statute are issued a State ID Card. It is our goal to provide

quality service that is applied fairly and consistently to all applicants in a helpful and friendly manner.

Major activities in 2013:

Conduct Examinations

During 2013, Driving Licensing Staff processed 638,729 applicants in 97 exam stations statewide. This included new applicants (licensed individuals who moved to Nebraska from another state, individuals who had never been issued a license document before and individuals whose Nebraska license document had been expired over one year), renewal applicants, and applicants requesting replacement and duplicate documents.

Online Renewal

Eligible individuals renewed their Class O (car), Class M (motorcycle) licenses and State ID Cards online and obtain duplicates of the same. In addition, the online renewal option was expanded in 2013 to include Ignition Interlock Permits (IIP), School Permits (SCP), Provisional Operator's Permits (POP) (if specific requirements were met), as well as licenses for individuals going from a POP to their first operator's license.

Training Unit

The Training Unit developed the following content for DMV employees in 2013:

There is a total of 342 pieces of content developed and available. There are currently 1,457 online training items registered to be taken, 168 online training items in progress and 10,468 online training items completed for a total of 12,093 online items accessed in 2013.

The Breath Alcohol Training Program was transitioned to the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center. However, the content developed by the Department of Motor Vehicles is still being utilized.

A total of 19 employees were trained in Fraud Detection and Remediation Level I online training, 10 were trained in Fraud Detection and Remediation Level II online training.

The unit also trained 19 newly hired driver license examiners in 2013 along with 11 temporary helpers.

Renewal Notices

Renewal notices are sent 90 days in advance of the expiration of a driver license or State ID Card. In 2013, the Department sent out 273,317 renewal notices. Of those, 85,181 (19%) of the applicants presented, the renewal notice to driver licensing staff; an action that expedites the applicant's time spent at the DMV.

Motorcycle Safety Education Program

The Driver Licensing Service Division is responsible for the oversight of motorcycle rider training courses. Successful completion of the beginning Motorcycle Education Course allows the applicant to waive both the written and road test at the DMV driver licensing office to receive a Class "M" license or endorsement.


Currently, 10 Providers are certified by DMV to offer motorcycle safety education training. A total of 2,277 applicants participated in rider training courses in 2013. Of those, 2,095 individuals successfully completed the training. At the end of 2013, the Nebraska Motorcycle Safety Education Program had a total of 94 certified instructors to teach the various courses.

Additional activities in the achievement of our goals/accomplishments include:

- Audited 36 CDL Third Party Testers (companies). Auditors also observed 37 skills tests being administered by third party examiners (36 overtly and 1 covertly). DMV certified individuals who work for these companies are authorized to administer skills testing for applicants who desire a commercial driver license. The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration requires the DMV to audit these companies annually. The audit consists of a review of paperwork and sample retesting of drivers that have previously passed.
- Audited 23 Driver Training Schools. Driver Training Schools teach individuals how to drive a motor vehicle. During each audit, the facilities of the school are inspected to make sure all requirements are met as outlined in the rules and regulations.
- Audited 52 DMV approved Driver Safety Courses; four schools were added and 10 schools dropped their certification. The Department currently has 145 DMV approved Driver Safety Courses. DMV rules and regulations require that instructors who work for these courses provide 20 hours of classroom training and 5 hours of behind the wheel training for individuals between the ages of 14-18. These instructors are also authorized to administer the DMV drive test upon completion of the course. The audit consists of a review of their paperwork and their DMV approved drive test route.
- The Nebraska Driver's Manual and written tests (English and Spanish versions) were updated with legislative changes from the previous year's legislative session.
- The interactive driver license practice test was updated with legislative changes from the previous year's legislative session. This interactive test can be found on the Department's website and assists individuals studying for the written driver license examination. The website is: www.dmv.ne.gov
- State statute allows physicians, law enforcement officers or individuals who are concerned about another individual's capability to operate a motor vehicle safely to request a re-examination of the individual. If the Department's investigation shows

a re-examination is warranted, the individual is required to appear before driver license staff on a specified date and time at a specific driver licensing office. During the re-examination, the applicant must present a medical and vision statement that meets the Department's minimum standards, and pass the written and drive tests. If the applicant is unable to meet the medical and vision minimum standards or pass the written or drive tests, his or her license is cancelled. In 2013, 702 applicants were re-examined. Of those applicants, 15% retained their license, and 85% had their license cancelled.

- In January 2012, the Nebraska DMV implemented a new program to become
 compliant with a federal law requiring all CDL holders to self-certify as to what type
 of operation they engage in. All CDL drivers are required to comply with this
 requirement no later than January 30, 2014. In 2013, 56,523 Nebraska commercial
 drivers self-certified either at a driver licensing office or by mail.
- On March 18, 2013, the Nebraska DMV compared the residential addresses which reside on the driver licensing database against the U.S. Postal Service Change of Address Database. The comparison was comprised of one year's worth of data from the U.S. Postal Service. The analysis revealed 65,574 applicants were identified as having changed their addresses through the U.S. Postal Service, but not at the DMV. Postcards were sent to these individuals informing them state law requires individuals to change their address on licensing documents within 60 days of moving. Thirty-eight percent (25,355) of the individuals complied with the postcard request and changed their addresses. This comparison is done annually.
- The Division worked with Safe Roads Alliance, a non-profit to develop *The Parent's Supervised Driving Program*, a booklet promoting safer driving through education. The Program is designed to improve teen driver safety by providing parents and guardians with a methodical approach to teaching the requisite driving skills. Each lesson concentrates on a particular sequential skill. This Program is also available in PDF and e-reader forms. The *Parent's Supervised Driving Program* also includes a website, social medical pages and a mobile app. Beginning in July of 2013, the *Parent's supervised Driving Program* was distributed to all teens applying for Learner's Permits.

Driver and Vehicle Records

The responsibilities of the Driver and Vehicle Records Division include:

- Updating and maintaining the Nebraska Traffic Safety Database.
- Maintaining the Nebraska Vehicle Title and Registration (VTR) Database.
- Updating and maintaining the Nebraska Motor Vehicle Insurance Database.
- Managing the Electronic Lien and Title Program (ELT).
- Updating and maintaining the provider and participating lender list for use in the ELT program.
- Approval and issuance of specialty license plates.
- Printing and mailing registration renewal notices.
- Providing prompt, reliable and accurate vehicle and driver information.
- Ensuring that all standards are met in the driver license, title and registration, and handicapped parking permit issuance processes.
- Developing and supplying all related forms, plates, permits and applications.
- Investigating and making arrests of violations for alleged fraudulent practices relating to identity theft and motor vehicle fraud.
- Reviewing potential driver license matches as part of the driver license facial recognition process to determine if additional investigation is needed prior to issuance of a driver license document.

Major activities in 2013:

- LB 31, effective September 6, 2013, modified the length of time for which a temporary handicap permit may be issued. Permits are now issued for periods of three or six months only.
- LB 207, effective October 1, 2013, modified the registration fee distribution and renewal notice process. The computer programs for the registration fee distribution change were deployed and took effect on October 1, 2013. The fees for the issuance of each registration previously included a \$2.00 portion be directed to the county general fund and a \$1.50 portion be directed to the DMV Cash fund these amounts are now \$1.50 directed to the County General fund and \$2.00 to the DMV Cash Fund.

A new notice in letter form was designed, shared with county treasurers and other interested parties, modified, and deployed on October 31, 2013. This new notice replaced the previous postcard notices which were printed and mailed from each county treasurer office. The updated notice was designed in such a manner as to emphasize the availability of online registration renewal, provide the opportunity for vehicle/county specific messages, enhance the opportunity for postage savings, incorporate National Change of Address (NCOA) processes, and protect the privacy of vehicle owners.

The data for the notices is processed on the VTR system at the county level by county treasurer staff and sent electronically to the Nebraska State Print Shop. The Print Shop prints and inserts the notices into envelopes and forwards the envelopes to the State's mailing services vendor for NCOA processing and mailing.


• LB 801, effective September 6, 2013 modified the definition of utility vehicle (UTV) to include those units that are not more than 180 inches in length.


Additional activities in the achievement of our goals/accomplishments include:

- Manage online services related to the Division's activities.
- Approve and maintain a list of self-insured companies in Nebraska.
- Approve providers and participating lenders for the ELT program.
- Compile, maintain and provide a list of lenders for the use in the lien notation process at the county level.
- Process license plate and validation decal orders for all 93 counties.
- Complete requests for vehicle and driver records.
- Issue handicapped parking permits.
- Design, order, and distribute forms used by county officials in the issuance of driver licenses, titles, and registrations.
- Provide vehicle information concerning safety recall campaigns.
- Issuance of message, spirit, organizational, Gold Star Family, special interest, sample, amateur radio, ex-prisoner of war, Purple Heart, handicapped, Disabled American Veteran, Pearl Harbor Survivor, transporter, repossession, boat dealer trailer, antique, and film vehicle license plates.
- Provide help desk assistance to County Treasurers for the issuance of driver licenses, titles, and registrations.
- Provide assistance to the general public and law enforcement for driver license, title, registration, and handicapped parking permit related areas.
- Manage the transfer of information from and to other state DMV's.
- Provide clearance and military exemption information.
- Create and provide training to staff, agents, and other requesters for identity theft and motor vehicle related document authentication.
- Perform threat assessments resulting from threats of violence or actual violence, directed towards DMV employees.
- Perform facial recognition system queries for outside law enforcement agencies to aid in their criminal investigations.
