Change Management

VicToRy's Training team has been focused on identifying changes in business processes in order to better design upcoming in-class training sessions and ease the transition from VTR to VicToRy.

One example of an exciting business process change will include the tracking of dealer certificate "blue treasurer sheet" information in the system. Additionally, the system will provide users with enhanced tracking capabilities of issued dealer plates.

To communicate these changes, members of the VicToRy project have delivered demonstrations of the system, spoken during district meetings, and visited county treasurer offices. Through these and other efforts, the entire VicToRy project is dedicated to providing encouragement and support to all future VicToRy users.

System Verification Part Two

System Verification part two is off to a great start! With two new verifiers joining fourteen of our original volunteers, the group began their first week on the project undergoing some initial training in the VicToRy system. After receiving some instruction on basic navigation and functionality within the system, the verifiers received their testing scenarios. These scenarios provide the testers with a variety of situations that guide them in testing and evaluating the system. Through their feedback, changes are continuing to be made to improve the functionality of VicToRy.

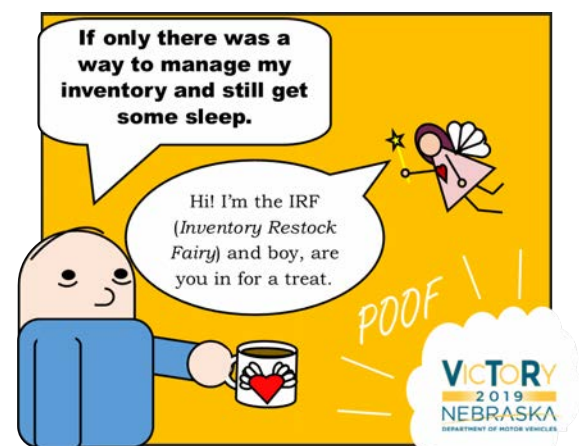
